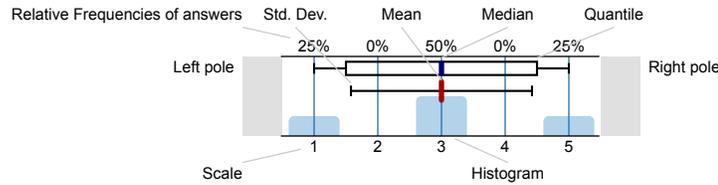






2.2) Instructor gave clear explanations.









5.2) What do you consider to be the greatest **WEAKNESS** of the **INSTRUCTOR**? Suggestions for improvement?

- Asynchronous classes do not work. Very little interaction with students. Felt alone and unsupported. Unfair. Many errors in the textbook and given codes.

5.4) What do you consider to be the greatest **WEAKNESS** of the **COURSE**? Suggestions for improvement?

- Doing group work for a lab-lecture format course online was difficult. Our groups found it was best to do the work individually and then compare answers. This resulted some students being left behind or still confused on the content. Hopefully going back to in person would fix this. Otherwise, maybe either switching to individual work or having a synchronous online meeting time to force students to work together and ask the instructor questions would be better.
- Homework due every day caused frustration, I always felt like I had numerical methods hanging over my head and it caused burnout which impacted my opinion of the course, although the consistency was appreciated.
- Lack of additional resources for topics
- No class meetings. ALL groupwork with NO ONE participating so you are left out to DRY EVERY WEEK! Horribly ran in my opinion no class should EVER be ran like this when students are paying THOUSANDS in tuition for classes. Unacceptable and little learning occurred. I can bet most of the class would agree.
- Taught asynchronously. errors in the textbook
- Textbook should not have been the only source of our information. I know the professor made himself available, but there should have been additional videos or websites to help out.
- The course structure isnt the best since we never had any verbal lectures. Also the groups made me want to just reach deadlines not actually learn the content
- The online, no meeting time format made it hard to stay engaged in the class.
